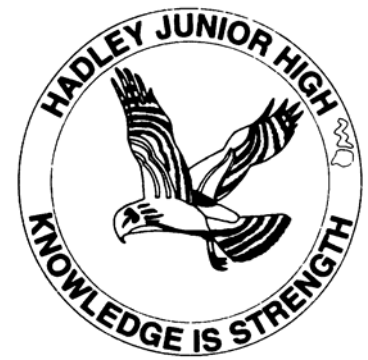

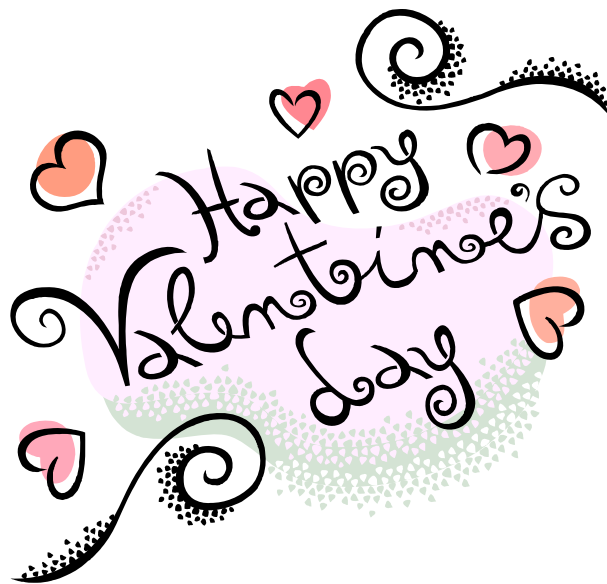

Important Notice to Parents/Guardians: HEAD LICE:

We have had two cases of Head Lice in the past two months. I would therefore like to ask for everyone's help to prevent possible lice infestations in the school. We ask you, as parents/guardians, to please examine your child's hair on a regular basis and if you do find lice or nits: please report this to the school immediately. Do not send your child to school until the proper treatment has been completed. Below you will find practical advice and information as well as treatment procedures to follow. *For more information, please consult your doctor, your pharmacist or a nurse from your local CLSC* Thank you for your continued cooperation and support!

How to get rid of them?

Act quickly and calmly

Your child has lice? There is no reason to panic: anyone can get lice! Although head lice infestations are not something we should feel ashamed of, they must be treated seriously because they are very contagious and can easily take epidemic proportions. Tens of millions of cases of head lice are reported each year in North America.

What are head lice?

Head lice are tiny grayish insects found exclusively on the human scalp. They are the size of a pinhead (0,5mm by 2mm), and can barely be seen with the naked eye. They multiply very quickly. Females lay several oval and whitish eggs called nits every day. The nits are firmly attached to hairs close to the skin surface. 7 to 9 days later, the nits hatch giving birth to young lice that then start their own life cycle.

How do I know that I have head lice?

The main symptom of lice infestation is itching which is caused by the bite of the insect. In most cases the itching is persistent and worsens in the evening. In severe cases, the bites may become infected when scratched, causing red spots. The infestation can be diagnosed by confirming the presence of lice on the hair and scalp, especially at the back of the head and behind the ears. Since lice are very small and active, their identification can become a difficult task. A fine-toothed comb can help you remove and identify the lice. Unmoving and numerous, the nits are easily identified. Oval and silvery white, the nits are smaller than lice (0.3mm by 0.8mm). They look like tiny grains of sand attached to the hair with a water-resistant substance that acts like glue. Nits must not be confounded with dandruff, skin debris or hair product residue. To avoid this confusion, simply check the level of adhesion (by washing or using your fingernails). You will find the nits difficult to remove compared to other substances.

How did I get lice?

Lice are transmitted primarily by intimate contact from one infested scalp to another. Children from 3 to 10 years old represent the most affected group. Day care centers, schools, school buses, summer camps – these places can promote contamination because of the close contact between children. Lice can also be transmitted indirectly by sharing personal articles such as headgear, scarves, headrests, bedding items, towels, hairbrushes, headphones, safety helmets, toys...

How are lice treated?

There are many types of treatment available to control head lice. They are available from your pharmacy without prescription. You must choose a product that will kill both lice and nits to prevent further infestation. (Nix product is no longer effective). Follow directions carefully.

Should nits be removed?

All lice and nits **must** be removed with a fine-toothed comb after the shampoo treatment. This operation requires a great deal of patience, but must be done in order to avoid re-infestation and to prevent future generations of lice becoming resistant to treatment. Nits must be removed immediately after rinsing with the fine-toothed comb, one lock of hair at a time, combing towards the scalp and then back. You can also remove the nits with your fingernails.

Should the whole family be treated?

All necessary precautions must be taken to avoid re-infestation. Anyone who has recently been in close contact with the infested person, whether it be family members or friends, should be informed, examined, and if needed, treated. Any other infested individual(s) should be treated at the same time.

What should be disinfected?

Clothes and bedding items must be washed in very hot water and dried in the hottest cycle of the dryer for at least 20 minutes. Items that cannot be washed must be either dry cleaned or sealed in a plastic bag for two weeks. Brushes and combs can be disinfected by soaking in hot water (55C or more) for 10 minutes. A thorough vacuuming of the infested child's room is recommended.

Be on the lookout!!!

At this time, there is no medicine or form of treatment that can totally protect us against head lice, but certain things can be done to prevent risks of infestation: daily brushing, weekly use of a fine-toothed comb and periodic examinations. In case of infestation, it is imperative that the treatment instructions be carefully followed.

REMINDER

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT PERMITTED AT SCHOOL

CAMERA'S / VIDEO CAMERA'S / CELL PHONES / PAGERS / BLACKBERRIES *etc*

Should your child choose to bring these items to school, then they are brought to school at the risk of the student. The school will not be held responsible for lost or stolen items.

However, we understand that some bus rides are very long, therefore DISKMAN / WALKMAN / I-PODS / ELECTRONIC GAMES are only permitted on transportation to and from school. Upon arrival to school, these items are to be placed immediately in the students locker and are not to be removed from the locker until it is time to go home. Once again, these items are brought to school at the risk of the students, and the school will not be held responsible for lost or stolen items.

BE ADVISED: Items may be confiscated; although they will be returned to the student it will be at the discretion of the principal, vice-principal or teacher.

The school will not be held responsible for these lost or stolen items.

Hadley Power-Play Program: our Power-Play program is an after-school program, designed to help students in certain subject areas. For each subject, there will be a 1.5 hour class after school weekly taught by a teacher. The curriculum for the class will consist of the most difficult units being learned in the subject throughout this school year. Dates and times of classes will be given, along with a syllabus, to all participants after the first day of after-school class. Classes Offered:

- Grade 7 Math
- Grade 7 and 8 English
- Grade 8 Math
- Grad 7 and 8 French as a Second Language

Power-Play Policies

- 1) Registration Forms must be completed and returned to the vice-principals Ms. McPhail (Gr 8) or Mrs. Fram Greig (Gr 7).
- 2) Homework for each course may be assigned.
- 3) There will be no issues related to student misbehaviour or absenteeism. Students who misbehave during Power-Play will not be allowed to return to class. Full Attendance is mandatory. There are no refunds.
- 4) All materials required for the course will be discussed during the first class.
- 5) A minimum of 20 students are required for a class to be offered. There is a maximum of 32 students for all courses (decisions will be based on a register-first / first serve basis).
- 6) Transportation home is NOT provided. Please make arrangements with students. Students are to be picked-up at 4:40pm.
- 7) The cost for 15 weeks of classes will be 50\$ per student.
