Last year we took a group of students to take to New York City. This proved to be an exciting and enriching experience for everyone. This extracurricular trip is open to all students; however only 42 to 48 students will be selected to participate based on 1st, student behavior and 2nd, student attitude at school.

The New York Trip will be scheduled in March or April. Students will leave for 3 days from Hadley an air-conditioned Voyageur bus. Each day will be filled with an itinerary of activities, such as visiting the Top of the rock, Bronx Zoo, seeing a Broadway Production, shopping on 5th Avenue and watching a hockey game!

It is essential that we start planning our trip immediately and so we are asking for confirmation from interested Students/Parents now. The cost of the New York trip will be around **\$ 460.00 Cdn**; this includes transportation, accommodation, all activities, supply teachers and two breakfasts and two dinners

- Students should also budget an **additional \$35 US dollars a day for other food** expenses as well as spending money.

We are asking that interested students bring in their permission slips as soon as possible. Please give them to Mme. Lacasse, so that the selection of students can be made shortly thereafter and further plans can be made.

The Canadian Red Cross Babysitting Course is offered to Gr. 7 students only and includes, basic caregiving and first aid skills, youth care for children confidently – or for themselves when home alone. **Space is limited to 15 students.** Cost is 20\$. The course is given over 8 weeks (*1 lunch hour per week*) Students who successfully complete the course will receive a Canadian Red Cross Babysitting Certificate Card.
